More than 2 million adults and 739,000 children in Connecticut have or will shortly receive economic impact payments of up to \$1,400 per person (on top of the \$600 per person provided in December).

The American Rescue Plan Act will provide working families an additional direct payment of \$1,400 per person:

- Single filers income up to \$75,000
- Head of household filers with incomes up to \$112,500
- Joint filers with income up to \$150,000

Who is eligible for the Economic Impact Payment? U.S. citizens or resident aliens who:

- Have a valid Social Security number,
- Could not be claimed as a dependent of another taxpayer, and had adjusted gross income under certain limits.

Who will receive the Economic Impact Payment automatically without taking additional steps?

Most eligible U.S. taxpayers will <u>automatically receive</u> their Economic Impact Payments including:

- Individuals who filed a federal income tax for 2019
- Individuals who receive Social Security retirement, disability (SSDI), Supplemental Security Income, Veterans' Disability Benefits, or survivor benefits
- Individuals who receive Railroad Retirement benefits
