Dear Secretary Azar,

We write urging you to immediately terminate Scott Lloyd as the Director of the Office of Refugee Resettlement (ORR). We are extremely troubled by the recent report that Mr. Lloyd's own personal policy has kept immigrant children detained for more than eight months¹ and we continue to be appalled by his actions to deny young women their constitutional right to have an abortion, putting their lives in danger.

The Director of ORR, as defined in the Homeland Security Act of 2002, is responsible for coordinating and implementing the care and placement of unaccompanied alien children (UACs) in federal custody. Last month's emergency motion filed by the New York Civil Liberties Union (NYCLU) to stop implementation of Director Lloyd's policy requiring "his personal approval be given before any immigrant child under heightened supervision can be released" proves that Director Lloyd is unfit to hold this position.²

It has been reported his policy has left children in secure or staff-secure care detained on average for eight months, with some immigrant children detained for more than one year. During Fiscal Year 2016, the children in secure or staff-secure care were typically released from ORR custody within 45 days. Furthermore, by law, ORR must ensure that children are "promptly placed in the least restrictive setting that is in the best interest of the child." If ORR has concluded that these children no longer pose a threat to anyone, there is no rational basis for keeping them detained for this extended period of time, which is anything but prompt.

Finally, we reiterate our previous calls that Director Lloyd's violation of young immigrant women's constitutional right to have an abortion warrants his termination effective immediately.

We ask once again that you ensure Mr. Lloyd is immediately terminated.
